

## NIGERIA IS IN BONDAGE

I once read of a man in a rare historical record who assumed a self-style appellation of "wickedest man in the world." His name was Aleister Crowley. He was a talented poet, but people referred to him as mad poet. He wrote and propagated SATANISM and power of sex as a form of magic. He advanced the cause of DEMONOLOGY, but could not complete the dissertation before his pathetic demise caused by drug addition. His satanic worship spread in US and Europe. Born in 1875 and died in 1947.

Our "evil genius" is very talented and has read a lot. He knew about the new international dispensation of globalism with the devices to sustain it to the disadvantage of third world countries, including his own country in which he will be one of the rich indigenous barons to work with the emerging super, super wealthy combines to rule the world of "democracy" of the rich by the rich for the rich. About N40 billions was squandered on transition. Many politicians were pauperized by demands of conditions for registration of political parties, some of which were conveyed in lorry loads. Elections with constant cancellations followed at all stages until the 1993 presidential election led to unforgettable tragedy.

Onslaught on newspapers and journalists led to what we have today. Many newspapers closed down and journalists either left the country or work now without regular pay. First letter bomb was introduced during his regime.


