is Dead


The All-Nigeria Peace and Solidarity Organisation has announced the death of its 40 year-old General Secretary, Comrade Moses Atukpe.

He died in an East Berlin hospital on Saturday August 9,1986 after a brief illness. He was buried seven days after in East Berlin..

Comrade Atukpe, fondly nicknamed "John Bull" by his ANPSO friends, was before his new appointment as General Secretary, the Commercial Controller of the New Horizon.

He is survived by a mother, his East German wife and two children. In a moving condolence message to his bereaved wife, the ANPSO Chairman, Comrade W.O. Goodluck described his death as shocking and irreparable loss and expressed the hope that his revolutionary spirit will keep marching on.

A special delegation of the ANPSO has paid a condolence visit to his aged mother, resident in Benin City.


