### NEWS NULGE REJECTS ECONOMICS OF HARDSHIP

A THREE day Special Seminar for members of the Nigeria Union of Local Government Employees (NULGE) Lagos State Branch, organised by IF & WOG Enterprises (Public and Industrial Relations Consultancy) was recently held at the National Secretariat of the Union.

The theme of the Seminar was: "The Role of Trade Union in a Delapidating Economy." Topics covered include: Trade Union History, Trade Union Decrees and Labour Laws, Trade Union Structure and Organisation, Trade Unions role in the Economy of the Nation, and Handling of Collective Bargaining.

The opening session which took place at Oke-Odo Hall of the Lagos Mainland Local Council was performed by Mr. Idowu Sowobi, a Senior Assistant Secretary of the Lagos State Government Secretariat on behalf of Mr. W.A. Sansaliyu, Lagos State Commissioner for Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs. Comrade F.C. Oramulu, National President of the Union gave the keynote address. Other speakers were Comrade W.O. Goodluck, Director of IF & WOG Enterprises and Alhaii S.A. Saliu, Lagos State President of NULGE.

In his address, Mr. Sansaliyu praised the National Union of Local Government Employees for the initiative they took in organising the Seminar to complement the comprehensive training and Staff Development of the State Government for all categories of Local Government Staff.


