




## Gurskii I. ELEMENTARY PHYSICS PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS. Cloth 13 x 21 cm 440 pp

The book presents the entire course of elementary physics in a consistent and concise form. The main emphasis is made on solving typical problems. Most of the problems are supplied with hints. For secondary school students, lecturers and students of preparatory departments of technical colleges and especially for those who study physics independently.

## Khodakov Yu., Epshtein D., Gloriozov P. INORGANIC CHEMISTRY. Part I. Paper 14 x 22 cm 250 pp

A considerable part of the book is devoted to studying quantitative relations in chemistry, to D.I. Mendeleev's periodic law and the periodic system of chemical elements. The concept of the chemical bond is introduced and actively used. The halogens and the oxygen subgroup are studied at the ionic level.



#### Kiseleva E., Karetnikov G., Kudryashov I. PROBLEMS AND EXERCISES IN PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY. Cloth 14 x 21.5 cm 456 pp

The book contains problems and examples in all the branches of physical chemistry that correspond to the curriculum for chemical colleges. Each chapter contains a list of the basic equations and symbols, problems with solutions, problems without solutions, but with answers, and multivariant problems. Intended for students of chemical and chemical-technological colleges.

#### Kitaigorodsky A., D.Sc. INTRODUCTION OF PHYSICS Cloth 16 x 24 cm 592 pp


