## About the Authors

**Claire Cohen** is an African-American revolutionary socialist and activist in Pittsburgh. She was a member of the local Malcolm X Commemorative Committee and has been involved in organizing an annual Martin Luther King Program. She was a founder of Women of Color for Reproductive Freedom and is a member of the Pittsburgh support committee for Black Workers for Justice.

She is currently working with a group of Black and other women of color under the auspices of the local rape crisis center to put on a conference in May, 1991 on Women of Color and Violence. Cohen is a member of the National Organizing Committee of the Fourth Internationalist Tendency.

**Steve Bloom** is the managing editor of the *Bulletin in Defense of Marxism*, in which the articles in this pamphlet were originally published. A native of Washington, D.C., Bloom became active in civil rights and antiwar activities in the mid-1960s, including working on the national staff of the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam. During the mid-1970s, Bloom was active in the National Student Coalition Against Racism in Brooklyn, New York. Bloom joined the Young Socialist Alliance in 1968 and the Socialist Workers Party in 1969. He was expelled from the SWP in a bureaucratic purge in 1984 and was a founder of the Fourth Internationalist Tendency. He is currently a member of the FIT's National Organizing Committee.

**Evelyn Sell** was raised in Detroit, Michigan, where she first became involved in socialist, union, and civil rights activities. She worked in support activity for the Montgomery bus boycott of the mid-1950s the sit-ins of the early 1960s. From 1963-67, she was the U.S. correspondent on civil rights for *World Outlook*, an international news service publication. Sell participated in defense activities for victims of racism and campaigned for the Michigan Freedom Now Party during the mid-1960s.

Sell was a founder of the Teachers Committee against Racism and the War in Vietnam. She now lives in Los Angeles, where she helped establish the Human Rights Committee of United Teachers Los Angeles.

Sell joined the Socialist Workers Party in 1949 and was a founder of the Young Socialist Alliance in 1960. In 1984 she was undemocratically expelled from the SWP and participated in the establishment of the Fourth Internationalist Tendency. She currently serves on its National Organizing Committee.
