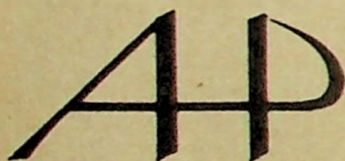

Background

AHP began as, and continues to be, primarily a membership organization. During the past decade, however, many attempts have been made to organize voluntary local and/or special-interest groups (AHP chapters, regions, networks, etc.). Results have been mixed. Some field activities have become regular sources of significant educational and social programs and experiences. Many others have burned out for lack of know-how, skills and support. Recognizing AHP's recently-announced policy of adding a societal dimension to its historic concern for individual growth, it would seem that AHP field activities should become increasingly effective. Toward that end, a two-day AHP FIELD ACTIVITIES WORKSHOP is being organized.

Announcement

Time/Place—9 am-5 pm, Thursday and Friday, August 28-29, 1980, at Snowmass, Colorado, immediately following AHP's 18th Annual Meeting (August 23-27). *Note:* Several preliminary gatherings of Workshop Participants will be held at convenient times during the course of the Annual Meeting.

Purpose—To draft (for recommendation to the AHP Executive Board) long-range guidelines for the organization, development and functioning of AHP Field Activities.

Anticipated Attendance—Representatives of existing AHP Field Activities; interested individuals; several AHP staff-members (a total of perhaps 50 participants).

Financing—Participants should expect to cover all their own expenses. *Note:* Limited funds will be available to existing, active AHP Field Activities (region, chapter) which choose to participate; and additional funds, if available, will be spent on food for Workshop participants.

Coordinator—Nancy Holden, of the Orange County/Long Beach AHP Chapter. Nancy will be working out of AHP's SF office.
